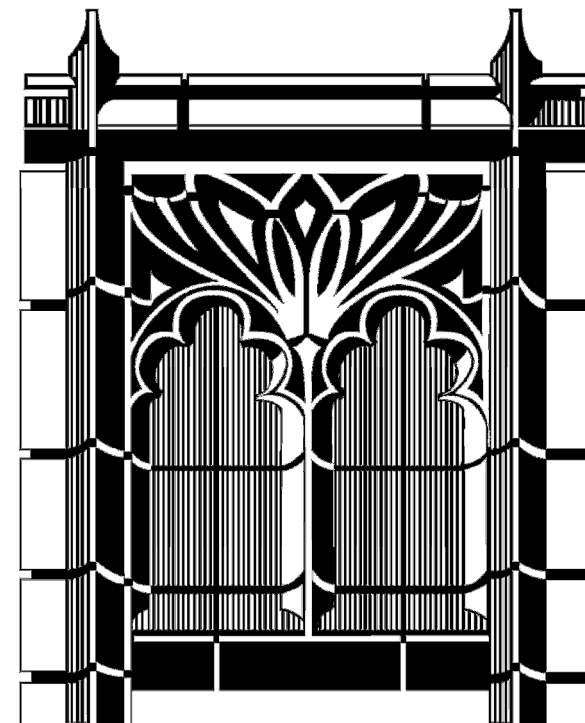

## About The Graduate School

Graduate study at the UW is overseen by the Dean of The Graduate School and a graduate faculty of over 2,500 members, selected for their scholarly and research qualifications and their concern with graduate education. Guidance is provided by The Graduate School Council.



Approximately 9,000 graduate students are working toward master's or doctoral degrees, and over 100 graduate programs are offered in UW departments or units.
